- Added new questions from
 - Subcommittee suggestions
 - Roads, Parks, Residential, Environment, Commercial
 - Input from the general community

Overview

- 640 total surveys mailed April 2, 2007
- 632 Postcard reminders mailed on April 16
- Additional mailing to 100 homes missed in April mailing, in June
- Approximately 350 completed
 - About 20% online
 - About 80% by mail
- About a dozen Casualties of Mail

Survey Committee Values

- Open, Collaborative Process
 - Judgment calls on survey development made by consensus (no less than three)
- “Auditable” results
- Confidential to individuals to encourage frank responses
- Every stakeholder holds equal weight in process
 - Results are not filtered by demographic

ONA Suggestions

Q12-How can the Oceanside Neighborhood Association become a better voice for the community?

- 129 people responded to the question.
- Rough analysis:
 - 22% suggest ONA could communicate better to members who are not full time (keep web site up, be more inclusive)
 - 20% feel ONA is difficult to participate in (narrow agenda, not representative, not welcoming)
 - 18% feel ONA is doing a good job
 - 15% feel ONA is not aggressive enough in taking positions, and in its relationship with the county
 - 6% thought the increased meetings were too much
 - 20% had a host of misc. suggestions

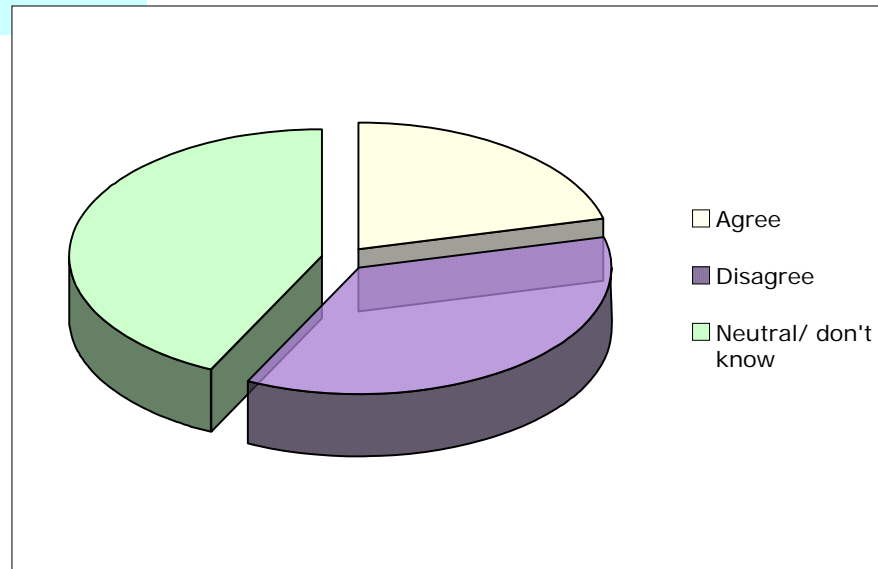

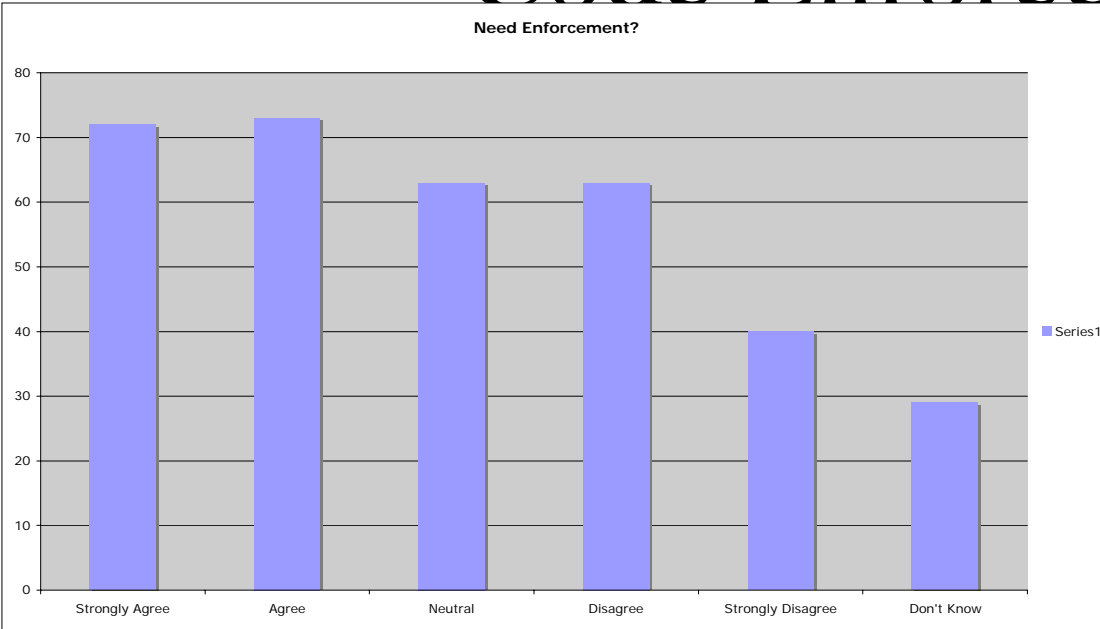

Ideas already moving forward

- The ONA web site has been updated with greater frequency & content
- A mailing will soon go out to the entire community to promote the ONA
- The next “Community Gathering” is now scheduled for October 6, 2007

Next Steps

- Survey update just completed and released to the Zone and Plan Review (ZAPR) Committee Friday Aug 2
- Make the results available to the general public through web - presentation AND raw results
 - www.oceansidefriends.org for links to survey results
- ZAPR plans to use survey results to
 - **Identify compelling support for new or revised ordinances**
 - Identify highly divided questions for future discussions
 - Identify opportunities for education
 - Capture “bright ideas” for follow-up
- Later: compare against 1995 & 2000 for perspective
